

What is my project and how will I know when it is successful?

- **Problem**: Oregon's preschool system is fractured and lacks infrastructure to support quality
- **Solution**: Create a policy and implementation plan that results in preschool that:
 - Reaches at least 10,000 more children by 2020
 - Increased funding for infrastructure (e.g., staffing and coaching)
 - Increased number of programs layering and blending funding
 - Increased funding and support for quality


Current State of Access to Pre-K

1,300 children living <200%FPL in select regions (see right) access Preschool Promise

8,100 children living <100-130% access Oregon Prekindergarten

~ I % of children with most severe needs have adequate service levels in ECSE

30,000+ 3-4 year-olds have no access to Pre-K and – in many regions – only enough licensed care of any quality to reach less than a quarter of preschool-aged children

What did I accomplish throughout the

year?

 Changed the structure of the Early Learning Division

- Wrote legislation to be introduced in 2019 to align preschool policy and change regional delivery model
- Wrote budget proposal to expand preschool slots and enhance state-funded Head Start (i.e., Oregon Prekindergarten), build infrastructure
- Secured Preschool Development Grant B-5 to seed changes to system (coordinated enrollment, community plans)
