

EMBEDDED PROJECT

- Mapping of NJ's early care and education programs and services to:
 - Avoid a duplication of services
 - Ensure programs, services and resources are allocated equitably
 - Allow for better alignment/coordination between state agency programs and services
 - Permit families to navigate through NJ's early childhood system with better ease

INTERVENING FACTORS

- NJ priorities
 - Preschool expansion
 - Preschool Development Birth to Five Grant
- Capacity/bandwidth
- Stakeholder mental models

MY RESPONSE AS A LEADER

Project shift to shared vision & collective buy-in Focused on system & internal causes (system structure)

Allowed issue to ripen & postponed for a later time

Took small actions to produce desirable results (leverage)
